affirmatively, it was felt that because of the political situation in Maryland, that it would not be too much to ask that we say no county shall be exempt because of the history of Maryland. But my question went to whether MR. MARTINEAU:

you were talking merely about the establishment of the government of counties, which is provided for by Section 1, in the first sentence of (b), which says, Which shall in their terms and in their effect apply alike to all counties.

Now, if you are talking about the general exemption from any legislation which doesn't refer to the establishment of county governments and the powers of county governments, and that is what this is under, then I think it's in the wrong place.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: The first sentence says, Shall legislate for counties only by the general law and thenstresses it, and it seems superfluous, I know, but we felt because of the political situations, it then had to be said in the negative in order tore-enforce it because of the political habits of Maryland.
