

1 it not a practical matter, in view of the limitations Mr.
2 Brooks mentioned? In other words, if the Legislature
3 grouped three counties for some particular purpose because
4 it wanted to pass local legislation applicable in those
5 three counties alone, and it used some criteria to do so,
6 it would then be tying its hands completely with reference
7 to any other classification of counties whatsoever. Would
8 not that restriction be enough to prevent any completely
9 nonsensible classification?

10 MR. SYKES: Well, is it true that if one classi-
11 fication is dissolved, all the legislation applicable to it
12 is necessarily dissolved?

13 THE CHAIRMAN: It may not be the language, but I
14 take it that would be the purpose of it. If you had local
15 legislation pertaining to a particular class and the class
16 disappeared, then I would anticipate the local legislation
17 would disappear with it.

18 MR. SYKES: Is it also contemplated by this
19 that -- well, if the population is adopted, there is no
20 problem. If some other criterion is adopted, there would
21 be no problem, but is it contemplated that there might be
