that the conviction be of serious crimes. Ready for the question? A vote aye is a vote in favor of the amendment suggested by Mrs. Bothe. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed, no. The Chair is in doubt. The ayes signify by raising hards. Contrary, no. Seven to ten. The motion is lost. Seven to ten.

Before we vote on the section as it stands, Mr. Russell, may I ask the Committee to consider whether it is necessary to provide in this second phrase authority in the Legislature to remove the exclusion from persons who have been pardoned.—I am afraid the way the language is now if the Legislature passed a law saying that one convicted of murder loses the right to vote it would perhaps not have the right to say that one pardoned regained. I make that as a suggestion for consideration.
