contemplate that its activities are going to cease on January 19.

In that connection, and thinking ahead a bit,

I wish also that the Members of the Commission would

be giving thought to the practical problems with which
we are confronted here. One of the immediate problems
and one of the reasons we have the Report of the Committee
on Convention Procedures on the agenda this week is the

question of whether the bill providing for the Convention next year should be submitted to the Legislative Council, or whether it would be desirable to have the bill presented at the first session, or the first day of the session of the new Legislature.

This poses a practical problem because, while

This poses a practical problem because, while offhand one would think it certainly would be desirable to present it to the Legislative Council, it must be kept in mind that the Legislative Council is a sort of a lame duck council. It is the remnant of the unapportioned Legislature and the Legislature that takes office next January, the apportioned Legislature, will be somewhat different in composition and perhaps in attitude.
