stands very high on the list of States throughout the country. Of course, I have learned this from our own budget people, but would to some extent discount what they say, but I think it is interesting and instructive to know that such a recognized authority as Clark Alberg would say that about the State of Maryland.

The only significant change that the 1916 budget bill has had was a change brought about by the Sobeloff.Commission's recommendations in 1952. Prior to the recommendations of the Sobeloff Commission, the budget and budget bill were submitted to the General Assembly by what we call line items. That is to say, each particular job or position in the State was given a line and an item, and there were so many lines and they ran literally into the thousands that nobody could make any sense out of the entire document as a whole, so the Sobeloff Commission, retaining nationally known consultants, recommended to the General Assembly and through them to the people, an amendment to the budget. an amendment which did away with the line item method of reporting and infused into the plan what is known as
