the program type budget, which is what we have today. The program budget establishes amounts for programs and then leaves the breaking down into the myriad of items to the various departments involved, so that is the basic picture. Prior to 1916 a piecemeal hit or miss method of controlling the expenditures of State funds; after 1916, and as a result of the commission, a strong executive budget written into the Constitution as the people's safeguard as to how their money is to be spent; the recognition that this was a good piece of work by experts in the field; a further amendment in the early Fifties converting the line item budget to the program type budget.

This, then, was the situation as we found it in the beginning of our consideration of the subject in the early summer, and this Committee has held a number of public hearings on this particular item, one of which lasted all day, the transcript of these hearings running into several hundreds of pages. We have interviewed the people that we felt were best able to assist us in determining what, if anything, could be done to improve the
