2 groups, we will have a voluminous document, indeed.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: May I say we are getting into
4 debate. Let's reserve that. Mr. Hoff?

5 MR. HOFF: There was one further argument
6 made, as I recall, that the complexities of our school
7 system require planning and programming for more than a
8 year ahead, and that a sudden interruption of a school
9 budget or a school program, as set forth, as might take
10 place where this guarantee of at least one year's con-
11 tinuation would be removed, could possibly disrupt ser-
12 iously the whole school system.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

14 MR. MILLER: I would like to ask a question.
15 As I understand it under present law, which would be
16 guaranteed under this Constitution until changed, a
17 minimum expenditure of \$340 per student must be made in
18 each jurisdiction?

19 MR. CASE: That is correct.

20 MR. MILLER: I also understood you said, and
21 I believe it is true, there has been cooperation, but
