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If you will look on Page 16 of the Report, Congressman, you will see exactly how it works.

MR. MILLER: I understand that that is the way it works now, but if we have local self-government and the tax is not levied, would the State under this provision still have to go ahead and pay it?

MR. CASE: No, sir. As I understand it, this is a State mandated item. It tells the local political subdivision that it has to raise an amount equal to 1.228 per cent of the sum of its adjusted assessed valuation on real property and its total net taxable ordinary income. Now, it has to raise that amount. If it doesn't raise it, it is out of the program and won't get any State money at all.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Freedlander?

MR, MILLER: Even if the budget called for it, it wouldn't get it?

MR. CASE: That is correct.
