Is there really any implication?

 MR. CASE: Let me make this point. There might come a time when the Legislature decided that it would give direct State aid for the transportation of parochial school children for example, and that this should be and the Legislature could say this shall be included in the public school budget. If that were done, and it were passed on and accepted by the courts, they would have to reverse, of course, the opinion of the Court of Appeals, but assuming that this were the case, so transportation to all schools would be a part of the local basic program of education, this would protect the transportation of parochial school children, I mean that expenditure as well as the public schools.

MR. SYKES: If the Legislature wanted to do
that, it could provide that appropriations should be made
and the Governor would be required to include that under
Subsection 2, under the language the Chairman referred to.

MR. CASE: It could if it wanted to set it in a dollar amount rather than work it in the public school program.
