MR. SYKES: If the Legislature didn't do that, does the same reason apply to public school systems as applies to private school systems, to prevent the Governor from having the power that he otherwise would have over or in the appropriation procedure? That is the only question I asked. I think the question is a lot narrower than the one you put.

MR. CASE: No question about it because the basic cornerstone or philosophical reason for the thing being to eliminate political pressures would be less likely to flow from the private than from the public school sector, so that the area is constricted.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further question? Any motion? If not, we move on.

MR. SYKES: I would move, in light of the Answers to the questions and what I think is the real effect of limiting this Section to public schools, which is not to prevent State aid to private schools, I would move that the word, public, be inserted between the words local and schools and I call attention in connection to that to the fact that in the existing Constitution --
