MRS. BOTHE: Yes, strike the word, local, 1 and substitute, public, which is the word used in the 2 present Constitution. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you accept that, Mr. Sykes? 4 MRS. SYKES: No, sir. I think it makes a 5 6 difference. THE CHAIRMAN: Any further debate or discussion 7 8 of this motion? MR. SYKES: May I make a last observation? Τt 9 is not debate. I think the record ought to show that 10 there is no intention in this motion to do enything which 11 would indicate our feeling of the realtive weights of the 12 arguments for or against State aid to private schools. The 13 motion that I made was intended to have no effect on 14 that problem at all, but was narrowly limited to the ques-15 tion of the powers of the Governor over the budget. 16 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Are 17 you ready for the question? The question arises on the 18 motion to amend Subsection 3 by inserting the word, public, 19 between the words, local and the word, school, in the 20

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fifth line of Subsection 3. All in favor of the motion,
