2 THE CHAIRMAN: Any questions?

3 Mr. Sykes?

4 MR. SYKES: Shouldn't the statement that is
5 required by the last sentence be a written statement so
6 it is right there in the Legislature and can be referred
7 to? I assume that is what is meant anyway. I am not
8 clear.

9 MR. CASE: Certainly, it would have to be a
10 statement, which would be conveyed to all Members, and I
11 suppose it couldn't be done other than by writing.

12 MR. SYKES: He could make it at a press con-
13 ference or he could tell the President of the Senate.

14 MR. CASE: This means a statement to the General
15 Assembly.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: It would hardly accompany the
17 amendment if it were done in a press conference.

18 MR. SYKES: Is it intended that ^{it} be a written
19 statement?

20 MR. CASE: In all candor, yes.

21 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment? Questions?
