1 do mean change in A and C. 2 MR. CASE: I would personally feel that the 3 word, affect, having been in the Constitution and been the 4 subject of at least administrative interpretation, ought to be the one to remain. We know what it means; maybe 5 6 not as a purist in the English language, we know what it 7 means, but we know as a practical working day matter what 8 it means. 9 MR. MILLER: Would the word, increase, accom-10 plish the goal instead of just say, affect, or change? 11 MR. CASE: No. If you said, increase, by 12 hypothesis you could decrease. 13 MR. MILLER: Would there be any objection if 14 they wanted to? 15 MR. CASE: Absolutely. That is the heart of 16 this provision, it can't be changed. 17 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further question? 18 Mr. Sykes? 19 MR. SYKES: I wanted to make a motion. 20 THE CHAIRMAN: Let's get the questions first.
