per cent permit them to go either way. When Mr. Donaho, who was a consultant to the Sobeloff Commission, consultant to Baltimore County and many of our Counties, and Mr. Walter Haile just spoke about him, when he came before our Commission, he said, and I think this is interesting on the subject, that when he first came to Maryland, he felt that the General Assembly or the elected people should have the right to go either way, but after working with this for a number of years, and dealing with it and seeing how it works, he was converted and felt that it was the better of the two systems, and I think he said that Governor Smiley in Washington State --

MR. SCANLAH: Idaho.

MR. CASE: Well, it is the one in Washington, that is where it was, they changed their Constitution, and he told me this as an aside, to bring this into his recommendation under Maryland practice.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry?

MR. GENTRY: The Judiciary submits its own get. Could they reduce salaries of some judges?

MR. CASE: No, they couldn't reduce. The
