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salaries of the judges which were fixed in the act are mandated items, and this is the same as the school budget.

MR. GENTRY: Even the Judiciary itself?

MR. CASE: It would not be subject to reduction.

MR. MINDEL: What about employees other than

MR. CASE: We had quite a long dir ussion with

judges in the judicial system?

Mr. Martineau, Mr. Invernize, Mr. Sachs and myself on this subject this week. If you have an employee whose salary was not specified as such by law, then the Governor would have a right to change that. He does change it now. As a matter of fact, the Governor goes over all of the nonmandated items and makes changes in them. The Governor and the Legislature would have a right to change it. I might say that Mr. Martineau, I don't want to speak for him, he is not here, but Mr. Sachs can correct my impression if I am wrong about this. After completely explaining to Mr. Martineau and to Mr. Invernize how this system would work with respect to the Judiciary, he was completely satisfied.
