2 MR. CASE: The idea is, of course, that this
3 is a State debt as defined.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: Can we leave that to the
5 Committee on Style?

6 MR. CASE: Yes, sir.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: It does not bother you?

8 MR. CASE: No.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

10 MR. MILLER: Mr. Chairman, getting back to
11 your first point, I don't think there is any argument
12 about substitute, but we have elsewhere in the Constitu-
13 tion that certain salaries can't be reduced. It doesn't
14 seem to me, it is the appropriation for salaries we are
15 talking about here rather than the right, going into
16 detail, of who is an employee and who is an officer. I
17 would think that the Committee on Style could work that
18 out a little better, so it doesn't look like we are
19 legislating out of place.
