

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

2 MR. MILLER: Mr. Chairman, it seems to me that
3 this whole Section, the fact we have had it in the prev-
4 ious Constitution, we are trying to improve and shorten
5 it. I don't see -- we are still discussing giving the
6 Legislative branch the power of subpoena, which I per-
7 sonally feel is necessary. If they could call somebody
8 in on reasonable grounds, why put it in the Constitution,
9 the same thing? As far as the Governor is concerned, as
10 a practical matter, you have had the same thing at the
11 Federal level. The Executive Department isn't going to
12 do anything it doesn't want to do anyway. Nobody can make
13 them do it.

14 It just seems to me we are building up a
15 lengthy document when it is not adding a thing to it.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Any other comment or questions?

17 Mr. Sayre?

18 MR. SAYRE: I have the same reservation. I
19 would like to have a little more elaboration on the validity
20 of the Governor to prevent someone in the Executive branch
21 from testifying if he so deems that desirable. You are
