6 to testify, I don't want my department head to testify,
7 or my Budget Bureau head or anyone else on something, I
8 don't know what, but if he says he doesn't want the person
9 to testify, he doesn't have to go over the Executive
10 Department, does he?

11 MR. CASE: Doesn't have to --

12 MR. SAYRE: He would not have control over the
13 Executive Department if the Legislature wanted to go
14 on a fishing trip every day of their session?

15 THE CHAIRMAN: You mean under this Section,
16 or under something else?

17 MR. SAYRE: Under Subsection 7. Isn't that
18 true?
