this year. If it didn't happen to fall every six years, we wouldn't necessarily have to elect a Senator. I wonder if we can preserve the constitution until the

Legislature should by law fix another date.

THE CHAIRMAN: This wouldn't meet Mr.
Martineau's point.

DR. BURDETTE: I realize that. I will speak on that by asking the legal profession here what is meant by the term general election? I think that is just at times in the present constitution and doesn't talk -
If we bring anything to referendum, it comes up at the

next general election. What does that mean?

THE CHAIRMAN: Does not necessarily mean state elections.

DR. BURDETTE: It does mean state-wide though?
THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

JUDGE ADKINS: Could we solve this by inserting the words election for state officers, unless otherwise provided herein, shall be held? It seems to me we can solve this dilemma by inserting the words for state officers, except as otherwise provided herein, that in
