20 21 prevail, and it could very easily prevail, then it would seem to me that the Legislature, despite the practicalities that have been suggested here by Dale Adkins, might indeed be shut off from additional information and information it should have.

Secondly, the second clause is equally as meaningful, because that says that the Governor shall have the right to appear, and if the separation of powers doctrine is presented to its ultimate, it might well be that the Governor could, or his people could be denied the right to appear, so on both counts, the Section gives an easy flow of rights and privileges between the Governor and the Legislature and to me is a very meaningful and helpful Section of the Constitution, and to just eliminate it because you want to shorten the document to me makes no sense at all.
