THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes?

MR. SYKES: To what extent does the power of the Governor to fund supplemental appropriations by increased revenue estimates impair the protection built into the requirement that there be no deficit financing?

MR. CASE: Well, there isn't any deficit if he comes up with an estimate that covers the appropriation. There is no budget deficit. There may eventually be a cash deficit, but actually even in its worst times, Maryland has been cash rich. It has had a tremendous amount of cash balances.

MR. SYKES: You don't see this as a problem?
MR. CASE: No.

MR. GENTRY: If we have as now proposed a Section in the Legislative Article, Section 15, which reads, No bill shall become law unless passed in each house by a majority of the members and on its passage the yea and nay votes --
