THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre?

MR. SAYRE: Perhaps this is a more appropriate question to ask in the next Section.

THE CHAIRMAN: The one you spoke to me about earlier?

MR. SAYRE: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: No. I think it would be better to wait. Any further discussion of Subsection 8? If not, we will proceed to Subsection 9, Page 32.

MR. CASE: These are just what we have left out. There have been some things we left out along the way I haven't mentioned. I don't know how far we want to get into this. I thought we finished with Subsection 9.

THE CHAIRMAN: You mentioned it in connection with an earlier one. That was all.

MR. CASE: If anybody has any questions about it, I will be glad to answer them.

THE CHAIRMAN: I had the same concern that I think it was Mr. Sayre expressed, and I take it that what you mean here is to say simply that the General Assembly
