1 to be by supplementary appropriation bill, which would 2 bring into play all the safeguards that you have thrown 3 around such a bill. Now my question, therefore, is 4 wouldn't this be made abundantly clear simply by striking the words, emergency appropriation, and saying, supple-5 6 mentary appropriation bill? . 7 MR. CASE: Sure. 8 MR. CLAGETT: I don't know that I can quite 9 agree with the answer given. I think there is a broader

connotation to the word, emergency appropriation, and there can be an appropriation which is neither a supplement nor is it supplementary.

THE CHAIRMAN: This is true. This is what troubled me about the language, but the Committee has made clear that there is no possibility under the draft that they propose to provide such an appropriation, except in one of those two manners.

MR. CLAGETT: I don't think that is right.

THE CHAIRMAN: This is implicit in the question
I asked the Committee on Section 2.

MR. CLAGETT: Because there is that question

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
