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in my mind I would move that they further consider Subsection 9.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second to the motion?

MR. SAYRE: Your motion?

No, Mr. Clagett's motion. THE CHAIRMAN:

Second. MR. GENTRY:

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett, do you want to say anything more?

MR. CLAGETT: I think the discussion has pointed up just what we mean by the motion to have the Committee further study and clarify. It is my understanding that the use of the language here is broader and not restricted only to supplementary bills.

THE CHAIRMAN: Now, I think Mr. Case ought to comment on it, and the crux of this comes down to the question that was asked with respect to Section 2, that if it is not provided for in the budget, it cannot come out of the general Treasury; that it must be by a supplementary appropriation bill, which must provide a tax, which would mean to me that in a special session, to meet an emergency, the Legislature would have to provide the
