2 merely calling the session, calling the General Assembly
3 back after a few days rest and going ahead and opening
4 the floodgates. To me that would not be right.

5 MR. SCANLAN: I gather, Dick, that this is
6 somewhat a clarification over old Subsection 14. That
7 language certainly could be construed as relieving an
8 extraordinary session from the restrictions that otherwise
9 apply, and your language in the new Section 9 makes it
10 perfectly clear that the regular restrictions on funding,
11 financing, et cetera, applies, is that correct?

12 MR. CASE: That is right. This may be some-
13 what inappropriately worded, but this is the idea.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes?

15 MR. SYKES: Mr. Chairman, can I suggest as a
16 solution to the problem here that it doesn't promote
17 clarity to call something a supplemental appropriation
18 which is not a supplemental appropriation. You have a
19 special circumstance here. In an emergency or extra-
20 ordinary session, you don't have a budget because the
21 budget is limited to the regular session. You don't have
