MR. SAYRE: If you go through the full thing, I interpret it exactly the way you do and the use of the word, emeigency, is really a carryover from the old Constitution, not needed here. An extraordinary session would be interpreted as emergency, and the only question here is, was the General Assembly called to consider a supplementary appropriation or while in an extraordinary session, they have the right to bring up a supplementary appropriation, if they so wish, is that right?

THE CHAIRMAN: That is not Mr. Clagett's question or what is implicit in his amendment. The Committee, as I understand it, has changed the Section so it now reads, The General Assembly may consider any supplementary appropriation bill at any extraordinary session. Mr. Clagett's motion is to have that reconsidered by the Committee, not on a matter of phraseology but on the principle that the Legislature at an extraordinary session ought to have the right to make an appropriation without providing the revenue to fund it. Is there any discussion on that question, which is before us?
