and it is not intended to encompass use tolls, such as employed for toll bridges, highways or capital expenditures when outside the Treasury.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second?

MR. CLAGETT: I will second it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Case, can you indicate what the position of the Committee is on this question?

MR. CASE: Well, the position of the Committee on this question is one of not so much of protestation as prostration. We are pretty well on our backs and up against a deadline. Let me first tell you what Phil is talking about, or at least try to explain it, and then suggest to you what I have said to him and also what is before the Committee.

In a number of State Constitutions, there are provisions which say, in effect, that the General Assembly, or the legislative body, cannot dedicate funds to any given purpose, and I think by and large that this is a good provision, because it prevents the rigid structuring of government through various revenue sources.
