1 to from Mr. Case.

MR. CASE: This is just a recital of fact.

MR. CLAGETT: I protest, too, because the Political Subdivisions Subcommittee has recommended the creation of authorities and the collection of a tax by those authorities, and that was amended by Mr. Adkins to provide that the authority could collect the tax levied by the Legislature, by the General Assembly, and it seems to me it fits in squarely with the problem that Mr. Case is being asked to make a study of and included in just his protest in having to do that.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment?

MR. CLAGETT: We don't feel qualified to do it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre?

MR. SAYRE: If no deadline is set and we simply ask for timely submission to this Commission of material on that subject, that would satisfy me as long as we get it before our attention. I am pleased with the State of Maryland now, but I am worried about where we might go if we don't have such a prohibition in regard to the future. I don't mean on existing things. Expediency
