provisions of an act, you run a risk that you don't include them all or that they don't exactly summarize all the provisions of the act. In any act, especially of this importance, there ought to be a general line in the title which doesn't say that the act provides for anything but says that the act relates to something. I would suggest that this be amended to read an act providing for all the specific things you want to provide for and at the end you should add and relating generally to a Constitutional Convention of this state.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Scanlan has noted it.

Any further questions as to the title?

MR. CASE: I have a fundamental question about this bill. I don't know whether now is the time to bring it up or not.

Everybody is so taken up with what the Constitution ought to be, I wonder if we have lost sight for a moment of what the Constitution is today.

I have some serious doubt as to whether this bill can be an emergency bill. The Constitution says now that no measure creating or abolishing an office or granting
