the state and in each legislative district of Baltimore City. The representation, of course, will be equal to the number of delegates that the city or county possessed in the General Assembly of Maryland on January 1, 1967. That number has already been approved by the action of the Legislature at the last session.

I think an item here that perhaps will give rise to differences of opinion is providing that the delegates are to be elected from the county as a whole except in the case of the City of Baltimore in which case they would be elected from the legislative districts of the City of Baltimore. I believe this matter was before the Commission in connection with one of our previous reports. There was considerable debate about it. It was the Committee's view that we would be better able to guarantee the non-partisan basis of the election if the delegates could come from a county as a whole that once you divided them into legislative districts there was a possibility of greater political pressure by the parties in the particular Baltimore was treated as a special exception county.
