DR. BURDETTE: Does the present statute with respect to election of members of the House of Delegates require that the persons elected from districts and counties be residents of the districts or residents of the county?

THE CHAIRMAN: I think we are required to be residents of the legislative district from which they are to run as delegates.

DR. BURDETTE: I imagine the point that the Committee in Section 2 which hasn't been brought up yet has language which if that be a fact is in conflict with Section 1 by providing that the delegates must possess all of the qualifications for a seat in the House of Delegates. There is a certain pyschological conflict here.

THE CHAIRMAN: In other words, one would be residence qualification in which you have a contrary recommendation. Any further discussion?

MR. HARGROVE: It occurs to me perhaps there also should be a period of residency. As I recall, the members of, particularly the reapportioned districts,
