about 142 persons who really require or should have a better background in government and governmental understanding than even those elected to the General Assembly of this state. That's a lot of people to have any special knowledge and understanding in government unfortunately.

The proposed size of the convention is actually an unusually large group to be writing the kind of document that might be desired for a state constitution. Although there is precedent in a few cases of having such large conventions prepare constitutions, we know that the majority of constitutions have been prepared by much smaller groups.

I think what Mr. Scanlan says in regard to how much easier it is to find really qualified people in certain areas of some of the counties rather than actually making a hardship by subdividing the county and then looking for a number of precisely qualified people in each district is much easier in spite of the risk that it may well be that you may lose all the qualified candidates against an organization
