There would be three elected from each of the other districts which might have three or more than three or less than three persons who were well qualified.

I cite this as an illustration merely to point out that the problem has no clear answer. It has dilemmas and difficulties no matter which solution you choose. I think we should carefully decide which we want to recommend.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Mr. Chairman, I think what you have said is applicable to the City of Baltimore also. I agree with what Mr. Brooks said that the caliber of people that would qualify for constitutional convention is different from that who may qualify for other policital office. If you select people from districts in Baltimore City, you run the risk of two things. Either there is no one who will have the time or financial means or ability or intelligence or interest or you will have what I have already gotten wind of, some of the political bosses are going to put up straw men -- I heard this in the city --
