MRS. BOTHE: Using your example, Mr. Eney, I feel quite concerned about the countywide election because if my understanding is correct, had you not had districting in Baltimore County, you might not even have any representation from the area in which you and Mr. Case live in the General Assembly.

The Baltimore County powers that be, as I understand them, are so divided that the districting is what has preserved some decent representation in Baltimore County in the General Assembly and I dare say may do so also in the convention. Just, for example, I don't want to make any particular comments about the members of the General Assembly from your county, but I don't think the representation is one which we would like to see in the convention altogether.
