DR. JENKINS: Mr. Chairman, I am sure we all want a very high level constitutional convention. But our concept of blue ribbon groups in our society is changing a bit as all of you lawyers know. I am not at all concerned about the lack of qualified people by districts. Granted that in some districts we may find a concentration, I hope we will not take the view that qualified people cannot be found in other districts.

My concern is how are we going to circumvent the politicians used in a narrow sense, not that people are not available in all of these districts.

MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I, like yourself, have mixed emotions about this. I would like to speak in support of -- before proposing a motion, there is just no question about the fact that the Chairman stated in Baltimore County, the larger pool of qualified people are going to be drawn, can be drawn from one district, and if the motion prevails, the effect will be to exclude some or a great number of these people from the Commission's deliberation. I think you have to think in terms of what the Chairman of this
