Committee said. Namely that what we are trying to do here is to get the best possible people on a nonpolitical basis and this can be done through such organizations as the League of Women Voters, as various other groups, do good groups, if you will, but still groups of this kind.

As far as the politicians are concerned, let me say this to you, Dr. Jenkins. Politicians are not going to mount any great assault on a ticket which is put together by these groups and has the unqualified support of the press unless they get a great deal of more y to do it because politicians don't operate as they do unless they have money to run their precincts unless they have money to print ballots, money to get their workers to the polls and so on.

DR. JENKINS: You are referring to politicians in the narrow sense, not statesmen?

MR. CASE: I am thinking of the people you talk of as politicians that get the vote out in Baltimore County, for example, in the Twelfth and Fifteenth Districts. I don't think people in the Twelfth
