agree with him that if people rise to principle we
will get the kind of delegates that we should have in
the convention. But his point of view as to what a
blue ribbon commission and what the people who vote
think a blue ribbon commission should be, I wonder if
there isn't a variance. As to Mr. Case's point, I
agree if there is no money the political machines, as
such, will not be interested. But I would like to point
out in the Fifth Legislative District of Baltimore City
there is \$50,000 in pay involved. I can assure Mr.
Case that the political machines of the Fifth Legislative
District of Baltimore City are going to field tickets
of what they consider qualified people, probably ex-
legislators, people who have been active in local and
state government and they will be running under political
aegis. You have \$6000, roughly the pay of a delegate,
I think it is rather unrealistic to feel the people
who have been active in electing delegates, 120 times
