risk is far out weighed by the chaotic results that 1 would occur if you elected at large and by the lack of 2 confidence in the Commission that would be inspired if 3 you created new districts that would look like they 4 are gerrymandered. 5 I would say you could safely MR. GENTRY: 6 predict now if the vote were at large in Baltimore 7 City, you would have all Adams, Aarons, Abrams, and 8 Browns and no one else would have a chance. Q MR. CASE: Going by lot. 10 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? I 11 would like to ask a question to get it on the record. 12 Am I correct that there are six delegates in each of the 13 seven Baltimore City --14 They vary. MR. SYKES: 15 THE CHAIRMAN: 42 or 43. 16 MR. SCANLAN: Six have seven and one has 17 eight. 18 MR. BROOKS: Three have eight, two have seven, 19 one has six. 20 MRS.
