MR. MINDEL: I am in favor of voting by districts.

DR. JENKINS: I can't conceive of voting for 43 people.

MRS. BOTHE: I have expressed my views.

MR. HARGROVE: I can't think of voting for 42 people.

MR. SCANLAN: In addition to Baltimore
City's large size, its unique qualities in the political
arena were also brought to the Committee's attention.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me finish the poll. Mr. Fond, I think you are the only other one in Baltimore City.

MR. BOND: My views are perfectly apparent.

THE CHAIRMAN: Does that give you your poll?

JUDGE ADKINS: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Ready for the question?

MRS. FREEDIANDER: I hate to have so many
fine opponents. I hesitate to argue. I want to point
out two things. One is special election. There would
be no other issues except this. In the last election
