from the Attorney General as to the members of the Legislature. It did not embrace other officers. The opinion was in all probability they would be barred. On that basis a bill was introduced to provide a constitutional amendment which would remove the bar. It was not passed.

MR. SAYRE: It seems to me we ought to request an opinion regarding members of any county council or board of supervisors on a local basis.

THE CHAIRMAN: I can't hear you.

MR. SAYRE: Wouldn't a member of a board of supervisors or county council be a civil office?

MR. MARTINEAU: I think there is no point in trying to discuss here any particular offices.

There are probably more opinions of the Attorney General on this particular question relating to various offices over the years than on any other question. It would be impossible for the Attorney General to give any full range opinion detailing all offices that would be barred. If the problem comes up, you can probably find the answer in the opinions of the Attorney General

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
