are only just a couple of lines.

MR. SCANIAN: I think we adopted this language because it is the language that has been in all the bills, earlier bills convening convention of 1831, '64, '67, and in every piece of legislation that was introduced over the last twenty years to convene a constitutional convention. Only difference in language here is the exception in favor of the minister of the Gospel. I agree we could write it affirmatively as Mr. Sykes suggests. On the other hand, the publicity that would be attendant to the convening of this convention certainly will give full notice of the requirements of eligibility.

THE CHAIRMAN: It seems to me, this is behind my earlier questions, it would be highly desirable to have the bill answer all questions to the greatest possible extent and not require further explanation.

If you provided it affirmatively here the qualifications are so simple that you would end up with a shorter section and would not have to have any special section as to minister of the Gospel, et cetera. It seems to
