to oppose the bill because we have not prescribed the usual oath that is dear to the hearts of every one of them. Since it really doesn't make a great deal of difference, I see no harm in keeping it in. You just create the possible hazard that the passage of the bill will be that much harder.

MR. CLAGETT: I think that is quite an important point because we are getting labeled to some extent as a blue ribbon committee anyway and here is something that some ody can point to showing that we are left wing-right wing liberal or something other than what we are.

THE CHAIRMAN: Ready for the question?

A vote aye is a vote in favor of deleting from the section the requirement of an affidavit in the form prescribed by Section 15 of Article 85(A). I take it that deletion does not eliminate the requirement. In other words, the motion is not, as I understand it, a motion to require the section to state affirmatively that the affidavit is not required.

MR. BOND: Let me speak to this one point.
