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machines throughout the state. In voting aye for this,

I would be saying a municipality could elect by paper
ballot.

THE CHAIRMAN: That is correct, so long as it preserved the secrecy.

MR. SAYRE: My basic dilenma was the state constitution should provide the absolute mandatory requirements that everyone has to abide by from the most local precinct up to the county or whatever level, that any additional requirements established by the municipality or county in addition but not restricting in the sense that it is depriving you of due process and your voting privileges that they may add on such as different voting machine gadgets or whatever. I am not sure any of these votes meant what I was trying to vote on.

MR. SCANLAN: That's what I figured.

MR. GENTRY: Because of the strange drafting problem you have left to the Committee, as I understand it now, the only thing we are reserving for state action is the age twenty-one, is that correct?
