2 is not alphabetical it is rough.

3 DR. BURDETTE: I think the way this could  
4 be done is to provide legislation that each candidate's  
5 name so far as possible appear an equal number of times  
6 in each position among the candidates. This is very  
7 much more easily done in case of paper ballots and is  
8 required by law in some states but this does not have  
9 the disadvantage of a lottery, it gives everybody an  
10 equal chance.

11 MR. SCANLAN: It enormously complicates the  
12 task. In one precinct, a man will appear in Line 1  
13 in another he will appear on Line 2. But the problem  
14 with that is some precincts are much larger than others  
15 and it is better to have your name on Line 1 in a precinct  
16 with 3000 voters than a precinct with 800. It raises  
17 all sorts of other complications. There has to be a  
18 limit to these things if government is to go on as  
19 Justice Holmes put it one time.
