a name, first one out of the hat is Line 1 and so on.
I don't think it will generate any confusion. In
Baltimore where the confusion might be the greatest we
have, the fact that it is divided into legislative
districts and perhaps you wouldn't have a great bulk
of candidates.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

MR. CIAGETT: Having been made aware of
the advantage of "C," I believe I am going to withdraw
from my position on the Committee and adopt another
one. Not to pun but being a "C" and seeing two "B's"
I think I will go along with them.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

Ready for the question? The question arises as to whether or not we have to weight the votes of those whose names are in the last half of the alphabet.

JUDGE ADKINS: Are we disqualified in the

first half?

MR. MARTINEAU: We ought to have a roll call.

MR. CASE: I am definitely voting in favor
