MR. CASE: Can somebody read it?

THE CHI.IRMAN: The substance of it was that Section 2 be rephrased to provide to be qualified a man be a resident of the state, citizen of the state, have been a resident of the state for three years and be a resident of the district from which he is elected for one year.

MR. CASE: But he could be all of those things and still a man, for example, in Baltimore County delegation could die and the Governor under this could appoint somebody from Prince Georges County who would have all those things and still fill the vacancy. There is nothing in this that says he has to appoint from the county where the dead man happened to represent. I think this is a fatal weakness. I agree with Dr. Burdette and I think it is also implicit in the Governor's right to appoint as well as the Convention. It ought to be made abundantly clear they have to pick them from the same political subdivision the deceased represented.
