have limited it to four months. The Michigan experience was that, as I recall, they had a salary of a thousand dollars a month up to a maximum of \$7500. That Convention lasted exactly seven and a half months. But we have put a limitation on it so the delegates who do run and are elected will know just how much time is involved and can order their personal affairs accordingly and will not spend forever in endless debate about things.

There is the provision, of course, that
the Governor at least five days before the formal
convening date will proclaim the date and advise everybody including the public. We come to a provision that
I don't believe has been discussed with this Commission
before. I now read from Line 11, the Governor shall
convene the Convention prior to September 12, 1967,
for the purpose of the election of officers for the
organization of the Convention and its committees, for
the selection of the members of the various committees,
and their chairmen and for the adoption of the rules
of procedure to be followed by the Convention. It was
the feeling upon the part of the Committee and others
