that it would be wise to utilize the period between June, the date of election of the delegates, and September, to get ready for the Convention so that the Convention wouldn't be obliged to spend perhaps as much as its first two or three weeks in organizing itself. Under the provisions of the bill, as I just stated them, the Governor could assemble the Convention not in formal session but could assemble the Convention for the purposes of drawing up Committees, for the purposes of drafting their rules of procedure, and selecting their various committees. So when September 12, 1967, rolled around, the Convention would be able to get off promptly on its important business, rather than consuming rather precious time in organizir; itself. Coing on in the bill, we provide that the President of the Senate of Maryland, of the State Senate, shall attend upon the initial meeting of the

Senate, shall attend upon the initial meeting of the Convention at the appointed hour and shall act as Chairman of the Convention until it shall be organized by the election of a temporary chairman. Hopefully if the delegates have met under the Governor's call in the
