THE CHAIRMAN: Traditionally in Maryland and, I believe, quite generally he is referred to as the President.

MR. MARTINEAU: It is signed at the end.

THE CHAIRMAN: In '67 I know it was and I think it was true in the earlier ones also. Any further questions on 8? Section 9.

MR. SCANLAN: First part of Section 9 deals with the compensation to be paid to the delegates.

I believe this Commission has approved the Committee's recommendation that the delegates to the Constitutional Convention shall receive a per diem payment of \$50 for each day's actual attendance upon the sessions of the Convention or meetings of authorized Committees or Subcommittees thereof. I believe that per diem payment, no other payment, no mileage or travel allowance, other types of expense allowance, corresponds, I thought, almost identical to what the average compensation of a member of the House of Delegates gets but, I believe,
