with respect to the amendment as we have it here for his compensation and expenses would certainly take care of that item and where he was authorized to go out to Chicago on a special mission, it would be a Convention expense.

MR. SCANLAN: That is right.

MR. GLAGETT: There would be no problem taking care of it on that basis.

MR. HARGROVE: Did the Committee consider that there might be some members of the Convention who might have to spend a considerable amount of time, for example, the President and the several other people who are elected who might have to spend a tremendous amount of time, I can think of the President being involved almost ten or twelve or fourteen hours a day, some additional compensation to them.

MR. SCANLAN: We didn't consider it. My own personal reaction would be that would be the price of glory and prestige..

MR. CLAGETT: As a matter of fact, we did consider it along that line.
